3 Offshore Cranes from Hamburg to Dalian/China		First shipment from China to Turkmenistan
	<p>In January 2009 we successfully shipped 3 port cranes and equipment with at all 4440cbm from Hamburg to Dalian. Together with our partner in Germany, we arranged the pick-up with special trucks from the supplier in Austria, since some of the items were out-of-gauge with dimensions up to 13m in length and the main-bodies with each a width and height of almost 4m. After loading on a bulk vessel in Hamburg, the cargo was shipped to Dalian port and there efficiently discharged under the supervision of our experienced local staff, so that the consignee could pick up the cargo without delay.</p>	<p>After successfully gaining a transportation contract for oilfield equipment to Turkmenistan in Dec.2008, World Shipping China handled the first shipment for that project. We shipped several containers of high-value equipment from Xiamen, China to Bandar Abbas, Iran and from there, with the assistance of our local partner, to the jobsite in Northern Turkmenistan.</p>
Cement shipment to Kenya		Container project from Xiamen - Hamburg
<p>As part of a long-term cooperation with one of our clients in Shandong Province, World Shipping China was handling ca. 1000 tons of cement (shipped in ca. 40x 20'GP containers) in Jan.2009. On the picture (right) you can see the loading process at the factory, which was supervised by our local staff. Afterwards, WSC organized the transfer to Qingdao port where the containers were directly loaded and shipped to Mombasa / Kenya. As part of our service, World Shipping China also handled the customs clearance and the documentation procedure in the port of loading.</p>		<p>Since 7 months World Shipping China can offer very exclusive ocean rates for direct container service from Xiamen to Hamburg. During this time we shipped already over 700 TEU for our clients - with increasing volume, despite the effects due to the financial crisis! We can proudly announce that we shipped in February alone 165 TEU's! And we are going to continue to improve this service for the benefits of our clients.</p>
Export of building materials to Libya		Trucks and tractors to Tanzania
	<p>The northern Africa region is one of the key areas for the development of World Shipping China and therefore we are happy to announce one further successful ocean shipment from Tianjin/China to Benghazi/Libya in January 2009. We were entrusted to ship ca. 150 tons (ca. 1000cbm) of building material for one of our VIP clients. The cargo was delivered to Tianjin port where World Shipping China arranged the stuffing of the cargo into containers. We also arranged all document handling (customs clearance, certification etc.) in China as well as in Benghazi so that the cargo could be shipped and received from the consignee without delay.</p>	<p>The activities of Chinese companies in Africa are increasing and World Shipping China is offering the connections and the know-how to handle shipments to all regions in Africa! In January we shipped 16 trucks, tractors, trailers and Asphalt sprinklers from Tianjin to Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania. The cargo was shipped partly as bulk cargo, partly in Open Top and High Cube containers. Our highly experienced port operators and export department professionals made sure the vehicles were picked up from the factory and safely lashed and placed in the containers and in the vessel, so that all items could be shipped smoothly.</p>
Bulk cargo to Haiphong/Vietnam		Nile Dutch (West Africa Service)
<p>One more time World Shipping China could show its ability to handle complex cargo's. From November 2008 to Jan.2009 we shipped ca. 5000 items of transmission and power equipment in several lots from the ports in Tianjin and Qingdao to Haiphong / Vietnam. The equipment was partly shipped in containers and approx. 11000cbm as bulk cargo. On the right side you can see some of the bigger items of this shipment.</p>		<p>World Shipping China has since 2006 a partnership with the Nile Dutch Shipping Line, a carrier that exclusively connects the ports in Western Africa with the rest of the world. In Dec.2008/Jan.2009 we shipped more than 300 TEU to several ports in Western Africa, mainly to: Luanda, Lubito/Angola and Pointe Noire/Congo. From April 2009 Nile Dutch will offer connections to other ports too (please see below in "New contracts, New developments")</p>

<p>World Shipping China could win one more contract for the transport of equipment for cement plant in Albania. This contract includes the shipment of several heavy pieces for one Raw Mill and one Clinker Mill that will be shipped from Antwerp to Durres Port in Albania and from there to the jobsite in the East of Albania. Some of the items are heavy-weight goods (95 and 111 tons), others are out-of-gauge (up to 6m wide / up to 4.4m high) that need to be handled with special equipment.</p>	<p>Since World Shipping China has increasing activities for the oilfield business in the Central Asia Region we are planning to open our own branch office in Ashgabad, Turkmenistan to offer our clients the full local support they are requesting.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>New Nile Dutch Services (West Africa)</u></p> <p>From April 2009 Nile Dutch Shipping will offer new direct connections from China to Lome/Togo, Tema/Ghana, Lagos/Nigeria.
